



**Eric Tomlon, FACHE, MBA/MSHA** is Chief Administration Officer and Chief of Staff at Healthcare Outcomes Performance Company (HOPCo). He has over 25 years of expertise in organizational structure and governance, operations management, human resources, physician relations, and building physician alignment strategies with health systems and payors. He is also a Fellow of the American College for Health Care Executives, and Member of the Medical Group Management Association and Society of Human Resources Management.
